So rejoice in God's love— you're + forgiven and free—and let God's new creation take shape in your life!



WORD AND PRAYER

FIRST READING:

2 Kings 5.1-15c

NRSVUE

Naaman, commander of the army of the king of Aram, was a great man and in high favor with his master because by him the LORD had given victory to Aram. The man, though a mighty warrior, suffered from a skin disease. ² Now the Arameans on one of their raids had taken a young girl captive from the land of Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. ³ She said to her mistress, "If only my lord were with the prophet who's in Samaria! He'd cure him of his skin disease." ⁴ So Naaman went in and told his lord just what the girl from the land of Israel had said. ⁵ And the king of Aram said, "Go, then, and I'll send along a letter to the king of Israel." So *Naaman* went, taking with him ten talents of silver, six thousand shekels of gold, and ten sets of garments. ⁶ He brought the letter to the king of Israel, which read, "When this letter reaches you, know that I've sent to you my servant Naaman, that you may cure him of his skin disease."

⁷When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, "Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his skin disease? Just look and see how he's trying to pick a quarrel with me!" ⁸But when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, he sent a message to the king, "Why have you torn your clothes? Let him come to me, that he may learn that there's a prophet in Israel."

⁹ So Naaman came with his horses and chariots and halted at the entrance of Elisha's house. ¹⁰ Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, "Go, wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored, and you shall be clean." ¹¹ But Naaman became angry and went away, saying, "I thought that for me he'd surely come out and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God and would wave his hand over the spot and cure the skin disease! ¹² Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Couldn't I wash in *them* and be clean?" He turned and went away in a rage. ¹³ But his servants approached and said to him, "Father, if the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, wouldn't you have done it? How much more, when all he said to you was, 'Wash, and be clean'?" ¹⁴ So he went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God; his flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and he was clean. ¹⁵ Then he returned to the man of God, he and all his company; he came and stood before him and said, "Now I know that there's no God in all the earth except in Israel!"

This is holy wisdom; this is holy word.

SECOND READING:

2 Timothy 2.8-15


NRSVUE

St Paul writes: Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David—that's my gospel, ⁹ for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God isn't chained. ¹⁰ Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that's in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. ¹¹ The saying is sure: "If we've died with Him, we'll also live with Him; ¹² if we endure, we'll also reign with Him; if we deny Him, He'll also deny us; ¹³ if we're faithless, He remains faithful—He can't deny Himself!"

¹⁴ Remind them of this, and warn them before the Lord that they're to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. ¹⁵ Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by Him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

This is holy wisdom; this is holy word.

THE HOLY GOSPEL:

Luke 17.11-19

NRSVUE

The Holy Gospel according to St Luke, the seventeenth chapter.

Glory to You, O Lord!

On the way to Jerusalem, Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² As He entered a village, ten men with a skin disease approached Him. Keeping their distance, ¹³ they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" ¹⁴ When He saw them, He said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. ¹⁵ Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. ¹⁶ He prostrated himself at Jesus's feet and thanked Him—and he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Then Jesus asked, "Weren't *ten* made clean? So where are the other nine? ¹⁸ Did none of them return to give glory to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ Then He said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."

This is the Gospel of our Lord.

Open our hearts so that we, like You, may welcome the strangers in our midst and share with them in our common journey from bondage to freedom and from death to life. God of mercy,

We rejoice in You as we delight in the abundance of Your good creation. As the earth brings forth its fruits, renew Your whole creation so that all creatures may be sustained and nourished. Have mercy on our brothers and sisters recovering from storms, wildfires, drought, and floods; give them Your strength to meet the days ahead, Your peace which surpasses all understanding, and renewed hope for restoration and rebuilding, and help us be Your hands and heart of help for them. God of mercy,

hear our prayer.

Pour out Your Spirit of peace, justice, and reconciliation on the nations of this world and their leaders. Turn us away from the ways of violence and domination; move us toward Your righteousness and justice;

and grant Your peace and restoration to those whose lives have been devastated by warfare, famine, or disaster in Ukraine, Gaza, Palestine, Lebanon, Iran, Libya, Yemen, Sudan, Haiti, the DRC, and homes and communities in our own nation. God of mercy,

God of mercy,

hear our prayer.

Gathered together in the sweet communion of the Holy Spirit, gracious God, we offer these and all our prayers to You; through Jesus Christ our Savior.

Reconciled to God and to one another, we share a sign of Christ's peace.






EUCHARISTIC PRAYER:

In the night in which He was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Take and eat. This is My body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of Me." Again after supper He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying "This cup is the new covenant in My blood shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of Me."

So with thanks giving, we take this bread and cup and proclaim the my stery of faith:

Christ has died! Christ is risen! Christ will come again!

Now send Your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts, that we may receive our Lord with a living faith as He comes to us in His holy Supper.

Empower us by that same Spirit to love and forgive, that our lives may anticipate that day when You'll make all things new.

All this we pray with joy through our Lord Jesus Christ, who's taught us to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by Thy Name!

Thy Kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For Thine is the Kingdom and the power and the glory, forever and ever! Amen.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

Now we share God's consecrated gifts among God's consecrated people, knowing that our living Lord Jesus is fully present with us in His Supper, giving Himself to us in bread and wine and forgiving love. Today, we'll share the Lord's Supper by receiving the body and blood of Christ by "tables" and the cup by intinction: When the usher bids you, come forward via the left side aisle, take a glass already filled with grape juice if necessary, and kneel or stand at the altar rail. Receive "the body of Christ, given for you" from the Pastor; receive "the blood of Christ, shed for you" from our communion assistant by dipping the wafer in the wine (or drink the grape juice you already have in hand). Pr Dave will dismiss each "table" with a blessing, at which point the next "table" will form. Once we've all communed, our service continues with thanksgiving...

SENDING

POST-COMMUNION PRAYER:

Gracious God, we give You thanks, for You've fed us at Your Table that we might abide in Your love and draw our life from You.

Now send us forth to bear the fruits of the Spirit, that all creation might be filled with the life of the risen Christ, in whose Name we pray. Amen.

BENEDICTION:

And now may God our Creator God open the pathways before you; may Christ Jesus cleanse you and make you whole; may the Holy Spirit keep your spirits alive and your feet from stumbling; and almighty God, Father, + Son, and Holy Spirit, bless you now and forever.
