Amen.



Alleluia! Christ is risen!


Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

WORD AND PRAYER

PREPARATION FOR THE WORD:

Pr Dave will introduce this song to us; then we'll sing it together two more times to let the tune (and the promise) sink in...

Behold, behold— I make all things new, beginning with you and starting from today. Behold, behold— I make all things new; My promise is true, for I am Christ the Way!

FIRST READING: Acts 11.1-18 NRSVUE

Now the apostles and the brothers and sisters who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. ² So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, ³ saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?"

⁴Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, ⁵ "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners, and it came close to me. ⁶As I looked at it closely, I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. ⁷I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat!' ⁸But I replied, 'By no means, Lord, for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' ⁹But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' ¹⁰This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven.

¹¹ At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. ¹² The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. ¹³ He told us how he'd seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who's called Peter; ¹⁴ he'll give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' ¹⁵ And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. ¹⁶ And I remembered the word of the Lord, how He'd said, 'John baptized with water, but you'll be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' ¹⁷ If, then, God gave them the same gift that *God* gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?"

¹⁸ When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life!"

This is holy wisdom; this is holy word.

SECOND READING:

Revelation 21.1-6

NRSVUE

John of Patmos writes: Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ² And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals! *God* will dwell with them; they'll be *God's* peoples, and God will be with them and be their God. ⁴ *God* will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away."

⁵ And the One who was seated on the throne said, "See, I'm making all things new!" Also, *the Holy One* said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true." ⁶ Then *God* said to me, "It's done! *I'm* the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To the thirsty, I'll give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life."

This is holy wisdom; this is holy word.




THE HOLY GOSPEL:

John 13.31-35

NRSVUE


The Holy Gospel according to St John, the thirteenth chapter.



When *Judas* had gone out *from the upper room*, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in Him. ³² If God has been glorified in Him, God will also glorify Him in God's self, and will glorify Him at once.

³³ "Little children, I'm with you only a little longer. You'll look for Me, and as I said to the *religious authorities*, so now I say to you, 'Where I'm going, you can't come.' ³⁴ I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I've loved you, you also should love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you're My disciples, if you have love for one another."

This is the Gospel of our Lord.

NICENE CREED:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth— of all that is, seen and unseen.

Forgive us for the ways we've caused creation to suffer. Inspire creativity as we explore new ways of reducing our consumption of earth's resources. Restore forests and waterways. Replenish the habitats of all endangered and threatened species. Merciful God, *receive our prayer.*

Call all nations, including our own, to the repentance that leads to life. Empower our leaders at every level of government to lead their communities with wisdom and compassion, especially for the most vulnerable among us. Disrupt the work of terrorists, religious and political extremists, and all who choose the way of violence over the way of mercy. Let Your peace and freedom triumph in Ukraine, Russia, Israel, Gaza, Palestine, Lebanon, Yemen, Sudan, Libya, Ethiopia, Haiti, Myanmar, the DRC, and violence-torn homes and communities in our own land, that all may know the blessings of Your grace. Merciful God,

receive our prayer.

Make Your home among us and shelter us from the storms of death, mourning, crying, and pain. Draw near to those who weep and to those who are lonely. Restore health and wholeness to all who are suffering, that they may experience Christ's death-defying life in their own renewal of strength and life. Pour out Your healing Holy Spirit upon and all whom we remember before You now... Merciful God,

receive our prayer.

You promise new life for all the faithful departed, and You promise to wipe away every tear from our eyes. Renew us in faith and hope until the day when death is no more, when You'll dwell with us in the new heaven and earth. Merciful God, *receive our prayer.*

The peace of the Lord is with you always.



OFFERTORY HYMN: "Let the Vineyards Be Fruitful"






Living God, You gather the wolf and the lamb to feed together in Your peaceable Reign, and You welcome us all at Your table.


Reach out to us through this meal, and show us Your wounded and risen body, that we may be nourished and believe in Christ Jesus our Savior and Lord.

Now send Your Holy Spirit upon us, that we may receive our Lord with a living faith as He comes to us in His holy Supper.


Empower us by that same Spirit to love and forgive,

CANTICLE: "Lamb of God"




THE HOLY COMMUNION

Now we share God's consecrated gifts among God's consecrated people, knowing that our living Lord Jesus is fully present with us in His Supper, giving Himself to us in bread and wine and forgiving love. Today, we'll share the Lord's Supper by receiving the body and blood of Christ by "tables": When the usher bids you, come forward via the left side aisle, take an empty glass from the tray (or a glass already filled with grape juice if necessary), and kneel or stand at the altar rail. Receive "the body of Christ, given for you" from the Pastor; receive "the blood of Christ, shed for you" from our communion assistant (or drink the grape juice you already have in hand). Pr Dave will dismiss each "table" with a blessing, at which point the next "table" will form. Once we've all communed, our service continues with thanksgiving...
