WORD AND PRAYER

FIRST READING: Isaiah 9.2-7

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. ³ You've enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before You as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder. ⁴ For as in the day of Midian's defeat, You've shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor. ⁵ Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire. ⁶ For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he'll be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there'll be no end. He'll reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this.

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the second chapter.

Glory to You, O Lord!

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to their own town to register. ⁴ So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵ He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, ⁷ and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

The highest, most holy, light of light eternal, born of a virgin, a mortal He comes;
Son of the Father now in flesh appearing!
Oh, come, let us adore Him, oh, come, let us adore Him,

⁸And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Don't be afraid! I bring you good news that'll cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He's the Messiah, the Lord. ¹²This will be a sign to you: You'll find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, ¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests!"

Sing, choirs of angels, sing in exultation!
Sing, all ye citizens of heaven above: "Glory to God in the highest!"
Oh, come, let us adore Him, oh, come, let us adore Him,

¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." ¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they'd seen Him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they'd heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

This is the Gospel of our Lord.

CONFESSION OF FAITH:

From Martin Luther's Small Catechism

I believe that Jesus Christ— true God, Son of the Father from eternity, and true man, born of the virgin Mary—

this same Jesus Christ is my Lord!

What child is this, who, laid to rest, on Mary's lap is sleeping?
Whom angels greet with anthems sweet while shepherds watch are keeping?
This, this is Christ the king, whom shepherds guard and angels sing;
Haste, haste to bring Him laud, the babe, the son of Mary!

At great cost He's saved and redeemed me, a lost and condemned person.

He's freed me from sin, death, and the power of the Devil, not with silver or gold, but with His holy and precious blood and His innocent suffering and death. Why lies He in such mean estate where ox and ass are feeding? Good Christian, fear; for sinners here the silent Word is pleading. Nails, spear shall pierce Him through, the cross be borne for me, for you; Hail, hail the Word made flesh, the Babe, the Son of Mary!

All this He's done that I might be His own, live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness,

just as He's risen from the dead and lives and rules eternally. This is most certainly true!

So bring Him incense, gold, and myrrh; come, peasant, king, to own Him.
The King of kings salvation brings; let loving hearts enthrone Him.
Raise, raise the song on high; the virgin sings her lullaby;
Joy, joy, for Christ is born, the Babe, the son of Mary!

THE PRAYERS AND PEACE:

Then trusting in this God, living in this Hope, let's pray for a world redeemed, the Church renewed, and all people restored in the Coming One:

Holy and gracious God, we give You thanks and praise for the incarnation of Your dear Son at the heart of human life, near to those who suffer, beside the sinner, among the poor, and with us now! Though we find Him tonight wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger, we long for the day when He'll rule Your creation with justice and righteousness unto endless peace.

So we bring to the manger our longing for the visible unity of Christ's body here and throughout the world, that we may proclaim with one undivided voice the One whose birth brings good news of glad tidings for all people.

We bring to the manger Your vision of the Reign of the Prince of Peace, praying that the nations, communities, and peoples of this world may see and cherish in one another the very image of Christ, whose scepter is mercy and whose justice is love.

We bring to the manger hope for the well-being of all creation, that every living thing may flourish in its preservation and abundance.

We bring to the manger those whose circumstances make it difficult to celebrate this holiday season, that the darkness of their struggle may be pierced by the light of Christ who takes their sufferings upon Himself.

We bring to the manger our own anxious hearts made even more frenzied by all the preparations of this season. Free us from our preoccupation with what's in the past; relieve us of our fears of what's yet to come; and give us the confident peace to live in this present moment fully and joyfully, in the full assurance that we live in the light of Your unfailing compassion.

We bring to the manger concern for those who have no place to lay their heads this night and for those who dwell in the shadow of loneliness, despair, illness, or death, especially those we remember before You now... Grant that their weakness may become the cradle in which Christ's healing presence is manifested anew, and that renewed in body and spirit, we may all encourage and strengthen one another.

We bring to the manger all those who, like the Holy Family, gather with children in the splendor of this most holy night, that the gift of faith in You may be lavished on our children and their children yet to come.

We bring to the manger the hopes and dreams of all the years, that with Mary and Joseph, angels and archangels, saints and martyrs, loved ones of every time and every place, our prayers and praises may join in a common song uniting heaven and earth in a single peace.

Trusting in Your mercy, saving God, we commend to You all for whom we pray, through the One born among us, Christ Jesus our Lord.

Amen.

And so, remembering His life given for us, rejoicing in His rising from the grave, we await His final appearing when all things will be restored in Him. Now pour out Your Holy Spirit upon us, that held and nourished by You, we who share the Lord's body and blood may live as His body in the world, ambassadors of His healing love, until all things are made whole in Him. How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is giv'n!
So God imparts to human hearts the blessings of His heav'n.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

Now we share God's consecrated gifts among God's consecrated people, knowing that our living Lord Jesus is fully present with us in His Supper, giving Himself to us in bread and wine and forgiving love. Today, we'll share the Lord's Supper by receiving the body and blood of Christ by "tables" and the cup by intinction: When the usher bids you, come forward via the left side aisle, take a glass already filled with grape juice if necessary, and kneel or stand at the altar rail. Receive "the body of Christ, given for you" from the Pastor; receive "the blood of Christ, shed for you" from our communion assistant by dipping the wafer in the wine (or drink the grape juice you already have in hand). Pr Dave will dismiss each "table" with a blessing, at which point the next "table" will form. Once we've all communed, our service continues with thanksgiving...

"May the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen us and keep us in His grace."

If you're joining us from your home, we invite you to share the bread and cup with one another. When giving the bread to your neighbor, say "The body of Christ, given for you." When giving the wine/grape juice say, "The blood of Christ, shed for you." Whatever's left over may be reverently eaten and drunk by everyone after our worship is over. Once we've all shared in the body and blood of Christ, we continue in blessing and prayer:

We thank You, wondrous God, for Christ Jesus, Immanuel, in these gifts of bread and wine. As we've shared this feast of love, strengthen us to share Your love with all the world through Christ Jesus our Savior and Lord.

CANDLELIGHTING RITE:

Jesus, Lord, at Your birth, love's pure light beams radiant from Your holy face. *The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*
